## ART AND DRAMA EXTENSION

This section is dedicated to additional ideas and recommended reading materials teachers may include in their lesson plan to compliment the  $Anytime\ Drama^{\text{TM}}$  curriculum. Teacher should assist as needed.

- Help children make tiger, elephant and clown masks to use in, "The Circus," play. Suggested materials include: pre-cut construction paper heads, ears, trunks, noses, mouths, eyes, etc., popsicle sticks and glue.
  - a) Teacher helps children select an animal head and glues or tapes a popsicle stick to the back of the head, leaving 2"-2 ½" hanging out (to be used to hold the mask up).
  - Teacher helps to select and glue eyes, noses, ears, trunks, etc. to the head.
- Help children color and decorate clown noses to use in, "Carnival Day," play. Suggested materials: pre-cut construction paper noses, crayons or markers, jewel stickers and tape.
  - a) Give each child a pre-cut round nose and let them color and decorate it.
  - b) Help children write their initials or name on the nose.
  - c) Place a piece of tape on the back to use for pin the nose on the clown game.
- Help children make their own ankle leis to use for luau activities throughout lesson. Suggested materials: 6" – 8" pieces of pre-cut yarn (two for each child), pre-cut flowers from construction paper with small holes punched in the middle (to string with yarn) and markers or crayons.
  - a) Help the children select two pieces of yarn and flowers to string on each
  - b) Help students string their flowers.
  - c) Tie ends of yarn together one around each ankle.
